This is the last round in a series of three residencies for artists working with sound / audio & musicians who are working class or from lower socio-economic backgrounds and currently based in Nottingham or Nottinghamshire. The artist or musician selected will be provided with a rent-free studio space at Primary for 3-months, as well as access to artist and professional development support.

About Primary

<u>Primary</u> is an artist-led contemporary visual arts organisation. We prioritise artistic <u>research</u>, provide <u>studios</u> and residencies to artists, and run a free <u>public programme</u> of exhibitions and events.

We've transformed a disused school in an inner-city area of Nottingham into a cultural resource, providing studios for over 50 artists, makers, and creatives at all stages in their careers and working across all media. Our spaces are secure, with shared facilities, and our resident artists have 24/7 access to the site. Primary also offers a uniquely supportive and collaborative creative community, with a dedicated <u>Artist Development Programme</u> supporting resident practices.

The artist or musician selected will be provided with a rent-free studio space within our building from **24 April – 23 July 2023**, as well as access to artist and professional development support.

- Have 1-2-1 mentoring with Primary's Artist Development Coordinator / Curator.
- Participate in activity as part of <u>Primary's Artist Development programme</u> including practical workshops, talks and discussions taking place during their residency period.
- Connect with residents, members and initiatives based at or supported by Primary.
- Share news, updates, and achievements with Primary's audiences via our website, social media channels and mailing list.
- Use Primary's communal spaces including the Garden, Meeting Room, Reading Room, and project spaces for self-initiated activity when there is availability.

Applicant Information

- This is an opportunity open to artists working with sound / audio and musicians from lower socio-economic backgrounds. Applicants might identify as working class or under class. No means testing will take place.
- Applicants must also be based in Nottingham or Nottinghamshire; this is because there is no travel budget available for this opportunity.
- We are open to alternative means of application / application submission, e.g., in the body of an email, presented as a recorded video or audio description.
- Applications are reviewed by a panel comprising two Primary staff members and one Primary resident / member.
